His explanations and anecdotes were extremely interesting, humorous and liberally filled with gruesome details of the punishment and beheadings for which the Tower is notorious. After an

hour or so we arrived at 'The Keys' the Yeoman Warder's bar and our opportunity to indulge in a drink or two and take part in their raffle, proceeds of which go to building expenses and donations to deserving charities. tradition of locking the gates. The ceremony finished with a memorable floodlight parade by the Irish Guards and a bugler sounding a moving rendition of the last post.

Thursday 31st July 2025




The RMA have arranged a visit to the beautiful and historic Gardens of Easton Lodge on Thursday 31st July. This was the home of Daisy, Countess of Warwick, a renowned socialit become a committee member e and close friend of King Edward VII who visited regularly. The gardens, originally designed by Harold Peto, had fallen into disrepair but have been lovingly restored by the Trustees volunteers over the past few years and remains a work in progress.

Our visit will start at 11.00 am at the entrance to the gardens where there is free parking and a guided tour of the gardens will commence at 11.30 where we will learn the history of the gardens and hear about the fascinating life of Daisy, the Countess of Warwick. Following the tour, tea/coffee and cake

will be served in the outside cafe. The cost of the visit, including refreshments will be £12 pp. Well behaved dogs are welcome, and you are free to bring a picnic if you wish.

The Gardens of Easton Lodge are located at Park Road, Great Dunmow, CM6 2BB. You can also use Park Road, Little Easton in your SATNAV. The Gardens are signposted by Brown Heritage signs. You will find the Gardens on Park Road about half a mile further on from the Little Easton church. Turn

PROTECT THE PEOPLE YOU CARE ABOUT: LET US KNOW WHO MIGHT NEED HELP TO ESCAPE

The ECFRS is urging families and carers to book a free Home Safety Visit for anyone who may find it difficult to escape their home in the event of a fire.

This includes people with reduced mobility, long-term health conditions, or disabilities that may slow down or prevent their ability to get out quickly during an emergency.

If it's required, ECFRS will also update its system to show that someone at the address may need help evacuating. If a fire is reported at the address, control room staff can share that vital information with fire crews before they arrive – helping firefighters prioritise a safe rescue.
